

School Closed for William Floyd Students K-12 on April 30, 2012

The New York State Education Department has scheduled State assessments in English Language Arts and Mathematics for all students in grades 3-8 within a short timeframe in April. This change makes the grading of these exams in a timely and restricted manner a challenging task. Although there is no easy answer, the district has implemented the best possible solution to ensure the continuity of valued classroom instruction.

The scoring of these assessments must follow State protocol, which involves approximately 30 teachers, at each grade level, for six or more days for each exam. Due to the fact that the district would not be able to secure enough substitutes, our students' instruction would be compromised.

In order to maintain a consistent instructional program and to reduce costs to the district, we have designated April 30, 2012, as an assessment scoring day. Therefore, there will be no school for students K-12. All district employees will report for work and all regularly scheduled evening activities will be held as planned.
